Omaha, Neb. – Ragazzi Youth choir of the Nebraska Choral Arts Society, based out of Sarpy County is currently planning a special collaboration, “A Few of Our Favorite Things” with the Cantilena Choir, one of the training children’s choirs of the Heartland Youth Chorus located in Des Moines, Iowa. Scheduled for Saturday, April 19, Ragazzi Youth will host the Cantilena Choir with a joint rehearsal, get-to-know-you dinner, and special collaborative concert. Curtain is 7:00 p.m. at Grace Lutheran Church, 1320 South 26th Street (26th and Woolworth) in Omaha. This concert is free and open to the public; a free-will offering will be taken.

“It’s always nice to work with other choirs. It gives the children of our organization a chance to meet other singers from the region and see that there are lots of people out there who love to sing,” stated Cody Talarico, conductor of the Ragazzi Youth and Ragazzi Children’s Choirs. “This concert is great timing for us,” continued Talarico, “Ragazzi Youth will have just returned from their tour to Ames and Des Moines, working with both the Ames Children’s Chorus and Iowa Youth Chorus. Collaborations like these are always great for the kids. They are relaxed and really let the kids get to know each other. Also, we’ll be performing in an area of town where we don’t do very many concerts.”

Talarico also serves as the organist for Grace Lutheran Church in addition to his teaching responsibilities with Bellevue Public Schools and his work with NCAS.

The Heartland Youth Chorus is a civic organization that serves over 150 central Iowa singers. The choir is divided into five leveled choirs with students ages 6-18. The program focuses on music literacy, healthy vocal development, and character building. Under the leadership of Sandy Miller, associate conductor of Heartland Youth Chorus, Cantilena Choir involves singers in grades four through six. Miller currently teaches music at Wallace Elementary in Johnston, Ia. She holds a Bachelor of Music Education degree from the University of Northern Iowa and is certified for Level I in both Orff-Schulwerk and Kodaly (both approaches to music education). Miller also directs the children's choir at Immanuel United Methodist Church in Des Moines.
